## Chapter 81.

Approved April 1, 1831.

*Resolved*, by the Senate and House of Representatives, that the Senators, of this State in the Congress of the United States, be instructed, and the Representatives requested, to

use their exertions to procure the passage of a law, for the more perfect organization of the Militia of the several States.

*Resolved*, That the Governor be requested to transmit copies of these Resolutions to the Senators and Representatives of this State in Congress.
