said Treasurer three dollars for the head of each bear, eight dollars for the head of each wolf, for the head of each wild-cat one dollar and one dollar for the head of each loup-cervier, which he shall present as aforesaid. And said Treasurer on presenting to the Legislature his account, verified by oath or affirmation, for the money paid by him as aforesaid, shall be allowed the amount of such account from the Treasury of the State. And it shall be the duty of all Treasurers of towns and plantations, who shall receive the head of any bear, wolf, wild-cat or loup-cervier as aforesaid, immediately, to destroy the same; and also carefully to preserve all affidavits received by him with the heads of animals as aforesaid.

Sum to be received for killing each animal.

Treasurer to present his account to Legislature, &c.

Chapter 10.

AN ACT to repeal An Act respecting Alewives in certain streams in the town of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That an Act entitled "an Act to regulate the taking of alewives in Winslow's stream and Leach's stream in the town of Penobscot," passed the sixteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, be and hereby is repealed.

Act passed 16th of Feb. 1828—repealed.

Chapter 11.

AN ACT relative to the appointment of Clerks of the Judicial Courts.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the Act entitled An additional Act respecting the appointment of Clerks of the Judicial*

1829, repealed.

Courts, passed the twenty first day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, and also an Act entitled An additional Act respecting the appointment of Clerks of the Judicial Courts, passed the fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine be and hereby are repealed.

Clerks now in
office shall hold
their office four
years from the
time of their ap-
pointments.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all Clerks now in office, appointed by virtue of the Acts hereby repealed, shall hold and exercise their aforesaid offices for the term of four years from the time of their respective appointments, and no longer, unless reappointed by the Governor with consent of Council. But all such Clerks shall be at all times subject to removal by the Governor, with consent of Council.

Chapter 12.

AN ACT to alter the time of holding a meeting of the County Commissioners in the County of Penobscot.

Meeting to be
held on the first
Tuesday of Au-
gust, annually.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County of Penobscot shall hereafter be held at Bangor in and for said County on the first Tuesday of August in each year instead of the first Tuesday of September as now by law established.

Chapter 13.

AN ACT in addition to the several Acts to regulate the jurisdiction and proceedings of Courts of Probate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That whenever request shall be made to the
