Chapter 12.

AN ACT to alter the time of holding a meeting of the County Commissioners in the County of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County of Penobscot shall hereafter be held at Bangor Meeting to be in and for said County on the first Tuesday of Au-Tuesday of Au-gust in each year instead of the first Tuesday of September as now by law established.

Chapter 13.

AN ACT in addition to the several Acts to regulate the jurisdiction and proceedings of Courts of Probate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled. That whenever request shall be made to the
