Chapter 16.

AN ACT respecting Banks and other Incorporated Companies.

House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That it shall be the duty of the Cashiers of Cashiers of the several Banks, and the Clerks or Secretaries of Companies &c. Provided however That such duty shall not be Proviso. required of said Cashiers oftener than once in each year by the Assessors of any such town or plantation.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That if any such Cashier, Secretary or Clerk shall refuse or Penalty for unnecessarily neglect to furnish such list on requisi-neglect or tion as aforesaid he shall forfeit and pay the sum of fifty dollars, for every such refusal or neglect, to the use of the town or plantation where such Assessors reside, to be recovered by the Treasurer of such town or plantation in any court competent to try the same.
