Chapter 21.

AN ACT relating to the duty of Assessors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be the duty of Assessors of the several towns and plantations in this State (the town of Portland excepted) to make out and deliver to the respective Surveyors of highways in said towns and plantations (excepting the town of Portland as aforesaid) the several tax bills, on or before the first day of June in each year.

Duty of Assessors of the several towns and plantations in this State.

Chapter 22.

AN ACT for preserving the Ticonic Bridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That if any person, after the first day of April next, shall willingly drive or ride any horse or horses across or upon the Ticonic Bridge between Waterville and Winslow, faster than at a walk, he shall forfeit for every such offence the sum of three dollars to be recovered by action of debt by the Treasurer of the Proprietors of said bridge, to their use; *Provided* said proprietors shall keep constantly exposed to view, at each end of said bridge, a sign or board upon which the substance of this regulation shall be conspicuously painted.

Penalty for driving or riding over the Ticonic Bridge, faster than at a walk—\$3,00.

Proviso.
