Chapter 23.

AN ACT additional to the several Acts for the preservation of Fish in Penobscot river and Bay and the several streams emptying into the same.

County Commissioners in Hancock, Penobscot and Waldo shall instead of one, appoint two persons for fish Wardens, in each of said Counties; who shall be sworn, &c.

Two of said wardens may perform all the duties executed by a majority of those appointed under the Act of 1829.

Their rights, powers and duties.

Further duties of said County Commissioners.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the County Commissioners of the Counties of Hancock, Penobscot and Waldo shall, at their respective sessions held next preceding the first day of May annually, instead of appointing one fish warden in each of said Counties, as provided for by an Act passed the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, appoint two persons for fish wardens in each of said Counties, who shall be sworn to the faithful performance of their trust. And any two of the six fish wardens so appointed shall and may do and perform within either of said Counties each and all of the duties which may now be performed by a majority of the fish wardens appointed under the Act aforesaid. And all the rights and powers, duties and liabilities conferred or enjoined by said Act upon the fish wardens, appointed under the same are hereby conferred and enjoined upon the fish wardens appointed in virtue of this Act.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That it is hereby made the duty of the County Commissioners of each of said Counties, immediately after appointing the fish wardens, as required by the first section of this Act, to notify to the County Commissioners of each of said other Counties the names of the fish wardens by them appointed as aforesaid.
