Chapter 30.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT to promote the sale and settlement of the Public Lands.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the Land Agent in lieu of returning copies of plans and field notes to the office of the Secretary of State as required by the second section of the Act to which this is additional shall deposit such copies of plans and field notes in a Land office at Bangor, and shall deposit the original plans and field notes in the Land office at Augusta.

Land Agent shall deposit copies of plans and field notes in a Land Office at Bangor, &c.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That in sales of land by the Land Agent, the lien which the State retains on the land, as security for the payment of the purchase money, may be expressed in the deed of conveyance from the State instead of taking a mortgage thereof.

Lien of the State security for Land sold, may be expressed in the deed of conveyance from the State instead of &c.

Chapter 31.

AN ACT repealing an Act, entitled "An Act to divide the State into Districts for the choice of Representatives in the Congress of the United States and prescribing the mode of election."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Act entitled an Act to divide the State into Districts for the choice of Representatives in the Congress of the United States, and prescribing the mode of election, approved February eighth, eighteen hundred and twenty three, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Act repealed.
