CHAPTER 219.

AN ACT to incorporate the Somerset and Kennebec Pasturage Company.

Approved February 7, 1832.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Elijah Fairbanks, Names of per-Elijah Wood, Elijah Wood Jr., Nathan Howard and Sewall sons incorporat-Prescott, with their associates and successors, be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Somerset and Kennebec Pasturage Company, for promoting the cause of Agriculture, and by that name may implead and be impleaded, have a common seal, make by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of the State, hold estate, real or personal, to such amount as may be necessary for said purpose, and have all the rights and powers usually grant-

ed to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be held at such time and place and First meeting. notified in such manner as any two of the above named persons may direct.

Be it further enacted, That the powers grant-Powers granted may be changed by this Act may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at ed. the pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER 220.

AN ACT to incorporate the China Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Approved February 9, 1832.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That John Brackett, Timothy F. Hanscomb, Alfred Marshall, Freeman Shaw, and Edmund Ward, their associates and successors, shall be and they hereby are created a corporation by the name of the China Mutual Fire Insurance Company, with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

For what purpose.

- Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That said corporation shall have, exercise, and enjoy, all the powers, rights and Powers, rights and immunities, and be subject to all the duties, restrictions—duties, reand liabilities, described in the second, third, fourth, fifth, liabilities. sixth, seventh, and eighth sections of an Act, entitled "an Act to incorporate the Hampden Mutual Fire Insurance Company, passed on the sixth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty.
- SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That any three of the persons above named, may call the first meeting of said First meeting by whom and corporation, by publishing notice thereof, in one of the how called. newspapers printed in the town of Augusta.
- SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That the office of said Office of Corpocorporation for transacting their business shall be kept in ration to be kept in the town of China.
- SECT. 5. Be it further enacted, That the powers granted ed by this Act may be enlarged, restrained, or annulled, may be changat the pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER 221.

AN ACT to change the name of the Maine Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 9, 1832.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the corporate name of the Maine Manufacturing Company be and it is hereby changfacturing Company have hereafter to be styled the which latter name the said Corporation shall hereafter be Portland Manufacturing Company, styled and known; and the said Portland Manufacturing pany. Company shall retain all the rights and privileges, and be Rights, privile subject to all the duties and obligations now belonging to eges, &c, the Maine Manufacturing Company.
