CHAPTER 227.

AN ACT to incorporate the Livermore Hemp Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 11, 1832.

Names of persons incorporated.
Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That John Fuller, Nathan Soule and William A. Emmons, with their associates and successors, be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Livermore Hemp Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of growing and manufacturing hemp, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and requirements, contained in an Act, passed the eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations; and in an additional Act, passed the fifth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, exempting from taxation manufacturing companies of cotton, wool, iron and steel for limited times; and shall be exempted from taxation, according to said Act.

May purchase and hold real estate, &c.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said corporation may purchase and hold estate, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, at any one time.

Powers granted may be changed.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.
