SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That David Bronson may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving such previous notice as he may think suitable, at which meeting any corporation business may be transacted.

CHAPTER 266.

AN ACT to incorporate the York County Agricultural Society.

Approved March 8, 1832.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Nathaniel Clark, Moses Sweat, Jeremiah Bradbury, Benjamin J. Herrick, Jeremiah Goodwin, Thomas Perkins, John Low, William A. Hayes, John P. Lord, Samuel Hill, Stephen Jenkins, Edmund Trafton, and their associates, successors and assigns be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the York County Agricultural Society, with power by that name to sue and be sued, use a common seal, make by-laws for the management of their concerns not repugnant to the laws of the State, purchase and hold estate, real or personal, the yearly income of which shall not exceed three thousand dollars, to be used exclusively in promoting Agriculture and the mechanic arts connected therewith. And said Corporation is hereby vested with all the rights and privileges usually granted to similar Corporations.

Names of Persons incorporated.

Powers &c.

May hold Real or Personal Estate.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers, granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Powers granted may be changed.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That Jeremiah Goodwin may call the first meeting of the Corporation, in such notice previously given, as he may judge necessary; at which meeting officers may be chosen and any corporation business transacted.
