improvement of agriculture and the mechanic arts connected therewith; and said corporation may sell or lease their estates at pleasure, and have and enjoy all the powers and privileges usually granted to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the powers grant-Powers granted ed by this Act may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That John Burnham may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving First meeting. such previous notice as he may judge suitable.

CHAPTER 271.

AN ACT to incorporate the East Somerset County Agricultural Society.

Approved March 8, 1832.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature ussembled, That Henry Warren, Names of Persons incorpora-Elijah Wood Jr., Augustus J. Brown, Sewall Prescott ted. and Jacob Stafford their associates and successors be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the East Somerset County Agricultural Society, with power by that Powers &c. name to prosecute and defend suits at law; to have a common seal; to make by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take and hold any estate, real or personal, the yearly income of which shall not exceed three thousand dollars, to be May hold read used exclusively for the promotion of Agriculture, and the tate &c. mechanic arts connected therewith, and may sell or lease the same at pleasure and have all the powers incident to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said Corporation may be called by any three of the persons above named on giving such notice as they may think proper.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers, grant-Powers granted ed by this Act, may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at ed. the pleasure of the Legislature.
