Powers and Privileges. by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of the State, for the management of their concerns; and have and enjoy all the rights and powers of similar corporations.

Where established. **SECT. 2.** *Be it further enacted,* That said society be and the same hereby is established in the County of York, and may have and hold any estate, real or personal, the annual income of which shall not exceed three thousand dollars, to be applied exclusively for the advancement of Agriculture and the mechanic arts connected therewith, and may lease or sell the same at pleasure.

May hold Real or Personal Estate. **SECT. 3.** *Be it further enacted,* That any two of the three persons, first above named may call the first meeting of said corporation, on giving such previous notice as they may think proper.

First meeting. **SECT. 4.** *Be it further enacted,* That the powers, granted by this act may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Powers granted may be changed.

CHAPTER 274.

AN ACT additional to an Act to establish the Oldtown Canal.

Approved March 8, 1832.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That there be and hereby is granted to the Proprietors of the Old Town Canal a further extension of time, in which to make and complete said Canal, of two years from and after the time limited for that purpose in the charter of incorporation.

Time extended.

CHAPTER 275.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Burlington.

Approved March 8, 1832.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the township numbered two in the first range of townships North of the Bingham Par-
