Chapter 13.

Resolve in favor of Cherryfield Academy.

Approved February 7, 1832.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is granted to Cherryfield Academy the sum of three hundred dollars, to be paid to the Trustees thereof, out of the Treasury of the State.

Chapter 14.

Resolve for the erection of a Gun House in Bath.

Approved February 8, 1832.

Resolved, That there be erected, under the direction of the Governor and Council, a Gun house in Bath in the County of Lincoln: *Provided*, that the expense thereof shall not exceed one hundred and fifty dollars, and that a suitable site therefor be conveyed to the State to be held for such term of time as said site may be occupied for the purpose of a Gun house.

Chapter 15.

Resolve in favor of Hugh M. Boynton.

Approved February 9, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Hugh M. Boynton the sum of twenty dollars in consequence of an injury sustained by him whilst on militia duty.

Chapter 16.

Resolve providing for the promulgation of the Laws of the State.

Approved February 11, 1832.

Resolved, That the publisher of the Public Newspaper, in which the Laws and Resolves of a public nature and ad-

vertisements are required to be published, he and hereby is required, within thirty days after the close of the Session of the Legislature in each year, to print all the public laws, passed at said Session, on extra and separate sheets of said Newspaper, and forward the same with their other papers to his subscribers. And the Secretary of State is required seasonably to furnish copies of said Laws for publication as aforesaid.

Resolved, further, That there be allowed to the said publisher, and to each of the printers of newspapers within this State, who shall publish and distribute the laws aforesaid to his subscribers, in manner aforesaid, within twenty days after said first publication, the sum of twenty five dollars, in lieu of the sum heretofore allowed.

Chapter 17.

Resolve in favor of Charles S. Preble.

Approved February 11, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Charles S. Preble of Bangor the sum of fifty dollars in remuneration for an injury sustained by him while doing militia duty.

Chapter 18.

Resolve for establishing the line between Brunswick and Freeport.

Approved February 11, 1832.

Resolved, That Joseph Sewall of Bath, William Bradbury of New Gloucester and William Cummings of Cape-Elizabeth be a Committee to establish the dividing line between the towns of Brunswick and Freeport in the County of Cumberland agreeably to the Acts of incorporation of said towns. And said committee shall be duly sworn to the faithful discharge of their trust, and shall give reasonable notice to all parties interested of the time and place of their meeting. And it shall be the duty of said committee or a major part of them to describe said boundary line by
