propriated by the State, and the aforesaid sum of one thousand dollars to be paid to him, by the town of Lincoln, in the making of said road, by making contracts for the construction of the same, in such manner as he may judge most beneficial to the State and town aforesaid ; and that the said sum of one thousand dollars be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Resolved, That the Agent be required to give a bond with surety or sureties satisfactory to the Governor and Council, for the faithful performance of his duty, and shall keep a correct account of all moneys by him received, and the sums by him expended, in making and repairing said road, and exhibit the same to the Governor and Council, who are hereby authorized to examine and adjust the same.

Chapter 40.

Resolve in favor of John G. Deane.

Approved February 25, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to John G. Deane, for services rendered and expenses incurred, in discharging the duties and trust, to which he was appointed by the Governor, with consent of Council, pursuant to a Resolve passed on the thirty first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty one, the sum of four hundred and seventy eight dollars and seventy nine cents.

Chapter 41.

Resolve for the admission of Allen Haines to practise law.

Approved February 25, 1832.

Resolved, That the Justices of the Court of Common Pleas, be and they hereby are authorized to admit Allen Haines to practise as an Attorney at Law, in said Court, in this State ; he paying the duty required by law ; on
