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### Chapter 95.

Resolve in favor of James Pribble.

Approved March 9, 1832.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to James Pribble the sum of five dollars and ninety five cents, for labor in stone-cutting on the Public Buildings at Augusta in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

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### Chapter 96.

Resolve relating to land in Township No. 5, 2d Range North of the Million Acres, East of Penobscot River.

Approved March 9, 1832.

*Resolved*, That the Land Agent be, and hereby is authorized and directed to release by deed of quitclaim, to Elishib Adams and Asa Davis of Bangor, the right, title and interest of the State, in and to the surplus quantity of land within the half township of land originally granted to Foxcroft Academy, and within the lines and boundaries as surveyed and now held by them, the said Adams and Davis, amounting by estimation to two thousand two hundred and two acres, agreeably to the award and determination of Allen Gilman and Thomas A. Hill, to whom with James Crosby, the question was referred.—*Provided*, that the said Adams and Davis, perform on their part, the award of the said Referees, viz. pay to the State Treasurer, for the use of the State, the sum of one thousand one hundred and one dollars, in the following manner—one fourth of said sum with interest annually, in each of the four succeeding years from the date of said award, which was the twentieth of September one thousand eight hundred and thirty one.
