Chapter 99.

Resolve for selling public lands in the Counties of Hancock and Washington.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Resolved, That the Land Agent be and he hereby is authorized to sell at public Auction, in the respective Counties where situated, all the lands belonging to the State within the Counties of Hancock and Washington, consisting of lots and parts of townships lying South of the North line of Bingham's purchase, on such terms of price and pay-day as he may judge for the best interest of the State.

Chapter 100.

Resolve in favor of Waterville College.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is granted to Waterville College, to be paid out of the Treasury of the State the sum of one thousand dollars, *Provided*, that the sum of five hundred dollars from the sum hereby granted, shall be appropriated, to the partial or total reduction of the term-bills of indigent students in said College.

Chapter 101.

Resolve in favor of Heard Lord.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Resolved, That there be paid from the Treasury of the State to Heard Lord the sum of thirty-eight dollars for his travel and attendance as a member of the House of Representatives in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.
