Chapter 104.

Resolve respecting the Journals of the Legislature.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House of Representatives be and they are hereby required to complete their Journals respectively and deliver the same into the office of Secretary of State, within forty days from the close of each session of the Legislature.

Chapter 105.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the State.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons mentioned in the additional Roll of Accounts, No. 13, the sums set against such persons' names respectively amounting in the whole to the sum of two hundred forty nine dollars and thirty three cents; in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.
