### Chapter 108.

Resolve in favor of Joseph D. Emery.

Approved Maarch 9, 1832.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid to Joseph D. Emery out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of three hundred and thirty eight dollars and twenty cents, which sum is to be in full for all services rendered by him on the Public Buildings of the State up to the second day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two, and also in full for all claims he has made against the State on account of Jeremiah Berry, Charles Williams, and Owners of the Schooner Sidney—and the Governor with advice of Council is authorized to draw his warrant on said Treasurer for the aforesaid sum.

### Chapter 109.

Resolve relating to a demand against Joseph Southwick.

Approved March 9, 1832.

*Resolved,* That the Land Agent be and he hereby is empowered to settle and discharge the demand in his office due to the State from Joseph Southwick, on said Southwick's procuring good security to the satisfaction of the Land Agent for the payment of said demand in four equal annual instalments with interest.

### Chapter 110.

Resolve making compensation for the services of the Draftsman.

Approved March 9, 1832.

*Resolved,* That there be paid from the Treasury of the State to Asa Redington Jr. for drafting Bills and Resolves the present session, the sum of one hundred and sixteen dollars, being at the rate of two dollars' per day, since he was employed by the Legislature for that purpose.
