Chapter 120.

Resolve extending the time for making highways in the County of Waldo.

Approved March 9, 1832.

Whereas a highway has been established in the County of Waldo, by the Court of Sessions of said County, commencing at the County road in Palermo, near Bradstreets Mills, and extending to the town line of Liberty near A. Lowells, and thence through said Liberty by George's pond to the County road near Samuel Edwards' farm; also another highway leading from the South village in Searsmont through Appleton and Liberty to Lights Mills in Washington, the making of which will be very expensive;

Resolved, therefore, that the several towns through which said highways pass are hereby allowed the space of five years from the passing of this Resolve, in which to open and make their respective parts thereof, notwithstanding a shorter time for said purpose was limited by said Court of Sessions. And no prosecution or process of any kind, brought against either of said towns, within said term of five years, for any neglect or omission to open and make their respective parts of said highways shall be sustained. And all indictments, complaints, informations, actions and other processes, brought against either of said towns, for the cause aforesaid, are hereby declared void in law, and shall be quashed.

Chapter 121.

Resolve on the Pay Roll of the House of Representatives.

Approved March 9, 1832.
