TOWN OF BEDDINGTON.

Proviso.

May choose harbor masters. Dollars for one offence: *Provided*, That said by-laws shall not be repugnant to the general laws of the State, and shall be approved by the Court of County Commissioners for the County of Lincoln, and published in a newspaper printed in said County.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That said inhabitants, at any such meeting, may choose one or more harbor-masters, whose duty it shall be to enforce the observance of said by-laws, and to exercise such powers as, in said by-laws, may be conferred upon them.

CHAP'TER 298.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Beddington.

Approved January 31, 1833.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the township numbered twenty three, in the Middle Division, in the County of Washington, bounded, on the north, by township numbered twenty nine; on the east, by township numbered twenty four; on the south, by the township of Annsburgh; on the west, by township numbered twenty two; with the inhabitants thereof, be and the same hereby is, incorporated into a town by the name of Beddington.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That any Justice of the Peace for said County may issue his warrant, directing some person, resident in said town, to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at a time and place, specified in said warrant, for the choice of town officers.
