SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said Corporation may be called by said Warren Preston, by giving such notice as he may think proper.

First meeting.

CHAPTER 324.

AN ACT in addition to an Act to incorporate the town of Pembroke.

Approved February 15, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the inhabitants of the town of Pembroke be, and they hereby are, authorized to assess the rateable polls and estates in said town, a sum equal to said town's just proportion of the State and County Taxes, assessed upon the town of Dennysville, for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty two; and pay over the same to the Treasurer of said town of Dennysville, when thereto required. And said Treasurer is hereby authorized to receive, demand and recover the same to the use of the inhabitants of said town of Dennysville.

Inhabitants may assess on the rateable polls & estates in Pembroke a just proportion of the taxes assessed upon Dennysville for 1832.

Treasurer authorized to recover the same.

CHAPTER 325.

AN ACT in addition to An Act to incorporate the City of Portland.

Approved February 19, 1833.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That hereafter every law, act, ordinance or bill, for the appropriation of money, having passed both branches of the City Council, shall be presented to the Mayor of the City; and if he approve the same, he shall sign it; if not, he shall return it, in seven days with his objections, to that branch of the City Council.
