CHAPTER 333.

AN ACT for the benefit of the town of Dennyville.

Approved February 21, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That it shall be lawful for the inhabitants of the town of Dennyville, at any legal meeting, duly called for the purpose, to vote and raise such sum, as they may deem necessary, to be collected and paid in money, for defraying the expenses of opening and making any legally established public roads, town roads, or bridges within said town. And the sums, so voted and raised, shall be assessed and collected in the same manner as other sums of money, voted for town uses, are assessed and collected.

Inhabitants may vote to raise money for defraying the expense of making roads.

CHAPTER 334.

AN ACT in addition to an Act to annex the town of Corinna to the County of Penobscot.

Approved February 21, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That all persons holding Commissions of Justice of the Peace in the town of Corinna shall be authorized to act as Justices of the Peace in the County of Penobscot in the same manner as if their commissions had been originally granted for that County.
