way for the passage of fish within the times above specified, it shall be lawful for such Committee, or a majority of them, to make such sluice or passage way, and recover the expense thereof in an action of assumpsit against said owner or occupant. Their duty.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That if any person shall take any shad or alewives in said stream on the Saturday, Sunday or Monday of any week, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten Dollars for every such offence. But no person shall be prohibited by this or any other Act to catch any of said fish on any other days of the week.

CHAPTER 354.

AN ACT to incorporate the Pembroke Iron Works Company.

Approved February 28, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Ezekiel Foster, Daniel Kilby and Sullivan S. Rawson, with their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are made a Corporation, by the name of the Pembroke Iron Works Company, with power and for the purpose of manufacturing iron and steel in the town of Pembroke. And said Corporation are authorized to erect upon their own land in said town any mills, buildings or other machinery for said purposes, and may hold any estate, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding Three Hundred Thousand Dollars at any one time, and shall have all the powers, and be subject to all the duties and requirements, expressed in the several Acts of this State, defining the general powers and duties, incident to manufacturing Companies.
