CHAPTER 365.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT for the preservation of Fish in Penobscot Bay and River and the several streams emptying into the same.

Approved March 2, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Act passed the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, and the Act passed the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty two, be and they are hereby so modified and restrained, as not to extend or apply to the Duck-trap stream, so called, in the town of Lincolnville.

CHAPTER 366.

AN ACT to incorporate the Readfield Cotton and Woolen Manufacturing Company.

Approved March 2, 1833.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Thomas Ling, David F. Sampson, D. H. Lombard, Joseph Fogg and Stephen Pilsbury, with their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a Corporation, by the name of the Readfield Cotton and Woolen Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of carrying on and encouraging domestic manufactures at Readfield in the County of Kennebec. And said Corporation may, upon their own land, erect all necessary mills, works and machinery for said purposes, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements, expressed in the several Acts of this State, defining the general powers and duties, incident to manufacturing companies; and may take and hold any estate, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding, at any one time, the value of Fifty Thousand Dollars.
