CHAPTER 384.

AN ACT to empower the town of Augusta to raise money for certain purposes.

Approved March 4, 1833.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the inhabitants of the town of Augusta, at any legal meeting called and notified for the purpose, may vote, grant and raise money to indemnify those of their citizens, who executed a Bond to the Treasurer of State for the completion of the Public Buildings, for such sums as they may be called upon to pay upon said bond, to be assessed and collected, as other town taxes are by law to be assessed and collected.

Inhabitants of Augusta authorized to raise money to indemnify those who executed a Bond to the State Treasurer for the completion of the Public Buildings.
