Chapter 7.

Resolve for the benefit of James Barstow.

Approved January 30, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid, annually, out of the Treasury of the State, to James Barstow of Nobleborough, a pension of Four Dollars per month, during the pleasure of the Legislature, for an injury received by him while doing military duty.

Chapter 8.

Resolve in favor of Robert Burns.

Approved January 30, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Robert Burns of Madison, the sum of Twenty Three Dollars, on account of an injury received by him, while doing military duty.

Chapter 9.

Resolve relative to a Bridge in the town of Cherryfield.

Approved January 30, 1833.

Resolved, That the doings of the Court of Sessions of the County of Washington, in establishing a road and bridge across the tide waters of the Narraguagus river in the town of Cherryfield, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty, be and the same are hereby confirmed, and the said road and bridge made valid and legal, in the same manner as if there were no ebb and flow of the tide at the place where the same are constructed.
