### Chapter 13.

Resolve relative to a Turnpike Road.

Approved January 31, 1833.

*Whereas* Mark Trafton and others have petitioned to be incorporated into a Company, for the purpose of building a Turnpike road, from Levant village through Dutton or Hermon to Bangor, with power to demand tolls thereon;

*Resolved*, That Daniel Wilkins of Charlestown, Zebulon Bradley of Bangor, and Cyrus Moor of Dover, be a Committee, at the expense of said petitioners, to view the route aforesaid, first giving notice to one or more of the Selectmen of each town, through which they propose to view, of the time and place of their meeting, and of the time when they shall make their report to the Legislature; and also giving public notice of the same, by publishing in some newspaper, printed in the County of Penobscot, that all persons may then appear and show cause, if any they have, against the prayer of the petition.

### Chapter 14.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Approved February 2, 1833.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to Sebattis Neptune and Joseph Stanislaus, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the Seat of Government, as special Agents chosen by said tribe to call on the Executive and Legislature upon business relating to said tribe; and the Governor, with the advice of Council be, and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
