Chapter 23.

Resolve for the benefit of Ebenezer Dunlap.

Approved February 10, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid, annually, out of the Treasury of the State, to Ebenezer Dunlap, a pension of Three Dollars per month, to commence from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty three, and continue during the pleasure of the Legislature; it being on account of an injury, sustained by him while performing military duty.

Chapter 24.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Holden.

Approved February 13, 1833.

Resolved, That, for reasons set forth in the petition of Samuel Holden, who was an early settler upon the Canada road, there be paid to him, out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars.

Chapter 25.

Resolve for the relief of Tappan Jennings.

Approved February 14, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid, out of the Treasury of the State, to Tappan Jennings the sum of Thirty Dollars, on account of an injury sustained by him, while performing military duty.
