Chapter 26.

Resolve for the benefit of John Bennock.

Approved February 14, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid to John Bennock out of a fund, deposited in the Treasury of the State by Samuel Lowder, Junior, Public Administrator upon the estate of Sarah Leonard, deceased, the sum of Two Hundred and Seven Dollars and seventy eight cents, in full compensation for services by him rendered to the deceased. *Provided*, that said Bennock shall give to the State a bond in double the sum aforesaid, with sureties satisfactory to the Treasurer, conditioned to refund the sum which he may receive by virtue of this Resolve, with interest thereon, in case any person or persons, within five years, shall establish a title as heir or heirs at law to the estate of said deceased. But the said bond or any payment which may be made pursuant thereunto shall not be construed to bar any claim for said services, which the said Bennock may be able to establish, as creditor, against said estate.

Chapter 27.

Resolve in addition to a Resolve in favor of Herbert Savage.

Approved February 14, 1833.

Resolved, That, instead of the monthly pension of Eight Dollars, now allowed to Herbert Savage, by a Resolve passed on the twenty ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven, there shall be paid to him out of the Treasury of the State the sum of Six Dollars per month, from and after the passing of this Resolve, and said pension of Six Dollars per month shall continue during the pleasure of the Legislature.
