THIRTEENTH LEGISLATURE

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE SECOND DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE FOURTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE.

Chapter 28.

Resolve in favor of the town of Bangor.

Approved February 14, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid to the Treasurer of the town of Bangor for the benefit of said town out of the fund deposited in the Treasury of the State by Samuel Lowder, Jun., Public Administrator in the estate of Sarah Leonard deceased, the sum of Eighty Three Dollars, the same being in full for supplies furnished to Oliver Leonard and Sarah his wife, deceased, during their life time, by the Overseers of the Poor of said town; and that the Governor by advice of the Council be hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 29.

Resolve for the relief of Alvin Pike.

Approved February 14, 1833.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State the sum of Thirty Five Dollars to Alvin Pike, on account of an injury sustained by him, while performing military duty.

Chapter 30.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Approved February 15, 1833.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to Francis Lola, and Sebatis Tomer, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the Seat of Government, as special Agents, chosen by said tribe to call on the Executive and Legislature upon business relating to said tribe; and that the Governor with the advice of Council, be and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
