### Chapter 44.

Resolve in favor of Frederick Spofford and Nathaniel Treat.

Approved February 26, 1833.

*Resolved*, That the sum of Twenty Eight Dollars and Twelve Cents, be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Frederick Spofford and Nathaniel Treat in full for a deficiency in the quantity of land in lots numbered thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty three and twenty four, and lot numbered thirteen in the mile square range, in Township Number Four, East side of the Penobscot river, Old Indian Purchase, deeded by James Irish, Land Agent, to said Spofford and Treat, on the third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five.

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### Chapter 45.

Additional Resolve in favor of the Canada Road.

Approved February 26, 1833.

*Whereas*, Charles Miller and John C. Glidden, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty, entered into contract with, and gave bond to, the State to make a portion of the Canada Road, so called, West of the Bald Mountain, and it is important that the same be made and completed at all events in the course of the ensuing summer ; Therefore

*Resolved*, That, in case said Miller and Glidden shall not have commenced their labor on said road West of said Mountain, on or before the first day of June next, with the apparent intention and reasonable prospect of completing the same in the course of the season, it shall be the duty of the Agent for said road, for the time being, and he is hereby authorized to go on and make said road, or cause it to be made in a good and workmanlike manner. And that a sum not exceeding Twenty Five Hundred Dollars be and hereby is appropriated to defray the expense

thereof, payable out of the Treasury of the State at such times and in such several sums as the Governor and Council may direct. *Provided*, that said Agent procure bond, satisfactory to the Governor and Council, for the faithful expenditure of the same.

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### Chapter 46.

Resolve in favor of Charles Morris.

Approved February 26, 1833.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to Charles Morris, the sum of Eighteen Dollars which sum shall be in full for his travel and services as Messenger of the Senate, at the commencement of the present session.

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### Chapter 47.

Resolve for the payment of Contingent Expenses.

Approved February 26, 1833.

*Resolved*, That there be, and is hereby appropriated the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars for the payment of contingent expenses of the current political year, to be placed at the disposal of the Governor and Council, and for the expenditure of which they are to be accountable.

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### Chapter 48.

Resolve for locating a road from Brighton to Moose Head Lake.

Approved February 26, 1833.

*Resolved*, That the Governor, with the advice of Council, be and hereby is authorized to appoint an Agent, to view
