Chapter 68.

Resolve authorizing a loan in behalf of the State.

Approved March 2, 1833.

Resolved, That the Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized to borrow on the faith of the State, a sum not exceeding Fifteen Thousand Dollars, and at a rate of interest not exceeding five per centum per annum, redeemable at the pleasure of the Government.

Chapter 69.

Resolve for the relief of the town of Hartland,

Approved March 2, 1833.

Resolved, That the County Commissioners of the County of Somerset be and hereby are authorized to cause a sum, not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars, to be expended, out of the Treasury of said County, in aiding the inhabitants of the town of Hartland in making a County road in said town, extending from the East line of the town of Cornville to Benjamin Chase's in Hartland.

Chapter 70.

Resolve in favor of Parsonsfield Seminary.

Approved March 2, 1833.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is granted to the Parsonsfield Seminary, to be paid out of the Treasury of the State, from any money derived from the tax on Banks, the sum of One Thousand Dollars: Provided, that the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars from the sum hereby granted, shall be appropriated to the partial or total reduction of the tuition of indigent Students in said Seminary.
