Chapter 79.

Resolve for the benefit of Joel Wellington.

Approved March 2, 1833.

Resolved, That upon each of the four notes of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars, due from Joel Wellington to the State, there be, and hereby is, allowed to Joel Wellington a further term of three years beyond the times limited in said several notes, for the payment thereof: *Provided,* that said Wellington shall not by this Resolve, be released from any liabilities for taxes upon the township of land for which said notes were given.

Chapter 80.

Resolve relating to the compensation of the Register of Probate of the County of Penobscot.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That instead of the sum, now allowed by law to the Register of Probate of the County of Penobscot there shall be annually allowed and paid to him out of the Treasury of said County the sum of Three Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars in full compensation for his services in said office. And said sum shall be paid to him in quarter yearly payments, viz. upon the first days of April, July, October and January in each year.

Chapter 81.

Resolve for the benefit of Jabez Bradbury.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid to Jabez Bradbury, out of the Treasury of the State, such damages as he may ultimately sustain, in consequence of an action brought against him, and now pending in the Supreme Judicial Court in the County of Penobscot, in favor of
