John K. Smith and their associates be authorized to erect a suitable Monument over the remains of the late Governor Lincoln, at their expense.

Chapter 92.

Resolve in favor of Parsonsfield Academy.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to deliver to the Trustees of Parsonsfield Academy, one copy of Greenleaf's Statistical View of Maine, with the maps which accompany the same, for the use of that Institution.

Chapter 93.

Resolve for laying out a Road connecting the Baring and Houlton Road with the United States Military Road.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That the Governor with advice of the Council be authorized to appoint an Agent to locate a road through the East half of Township numbered Six Townships numbered seven and eight in the second range North of Binghams purchase in the County of Penobscot to the Baring and Houlton Road.

Resolved, That there be appropriated out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars to defray the expense of locating said road and the Governor is hereby authorized to draw

his warrant on the Treasury for the same.
