Chapter 99.

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons mentioned in the Additional Roll of Accounts No. 14, the sums set against such persons' names respectively, amounting in the whole to the

sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Seventy Dollars and Forty Two Cents in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

Chapter 100.

Resolve in favor of William P. Preble.

Approved March 4, 1833.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to William Pitt Preble the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty Eight Dollars and Eighty Eight Cents, in full for his expenses incurred in the service of the State as Agent under the Resolve passed the nineteenth day of January in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty two—and that the Governor with advice of Council be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
