### Chapter 101.

Resolve on the Pay Roll of the Senate.

Approved March 4, 1833.

*Resolved*, That there be paid to the several persons named in the above and preceding Roll the sums set against their names respectively amounting to the sum of Four Thousand, Two Hundred and Eight Dollars.

### Chapter 102.

Resolve in favor of Abraham Osgood.

Approved March 4, 1833.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the Treasury to Abraham Osgood the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Five

Dollars, which sum shall be in full payment for the balance due him for building a Magazine at Portland under the direction of the Governor, agreeably to a Resolve of March third one thousand eight hundred and thirty two; and the Governor with advice of Council is hereby requested to draw his warrant on the Treasury accordingly.

### Chapter 103.

Resolve for the benefit of Asa Redington, Jr.

Approved March 4, 1833.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Asa Redington Jun'r, for drafting bills and Resolves the sum of Two Dollars per day, during the present session of the Legislature. And an additional sum of Five Dollars for Clerk hire.

### Chapter 104.

Resolve authorizing the sale of land in the town of Lincoln.

Approved March 4, 1833.

*Resolved,* That the Land Agent be authorized and directed to sell at auction to the highest bidder the unappropriated land belonging to the State in the town of Lincoln; having first advertised the time and place of sale, sixty days before the day of sale, in the newspapers printed in Bangor.
