Chapter 91.

AN ACT additional to "An Act regulating Judicial Process and Proceedings."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That no action shall be hereafter maintained to recover damages for an escape of any debtor, committed on execution, except a special action on the case. Special action on the case only to be maintained for debtor's escape.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That no action shall be maintained for such escape unless commenced within one year from the time the cause of action accrued. To be commenced within one year.

[Approved by the Governor, January 21st, 1834.]

Chapter 92.

AN ACT defining the time on which Public Statutes shall take effect.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That all Public Statutes shall be published, in the paper designated to print the laws of the State, within twenty days after the close of the session at which they are passed. Repealed.
