Chapter 109.

AN ACT additional regulating Elections.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That any town or plantation, whether classed with another for the choice of a Representative to the Legislature or not, the legal voters thereof, when assembled to vote for said Representative, may vote for such Representative on a separate ballot if said town or plantation shall by vote so determine.

Towns in certain cases may vote for Representative on separate ballot.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and the same hereby are repealed.

Chapter 110.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT establishing salaries for Judges and Registers of Probate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the salary of the Register of Probate for the County of Washington shall hereafter be Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars instead of the salary now established by law.

Chapter 111.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT increasing the salary of the Judge of Probate in the County of Penobscot, and fixing the times and places of holding the Probate Courts in said County.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the salary of the Judge of Probate for the County of Penobscot, shall be two hundred and seventy five dollars, in lieu of the salary now estab-

lished by law, commencing on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.

Courts of Probate, when and where to be held.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the said Judge shall annually hold a court, in Exeter, on the first Mondays of February and July; and successively in Dover on Tuesdays, in Maxfield on Wednesdays, and in Lincoln on Thursdays of the same week in each of said months, at such places in said towns and at such hours in said days as he shall appoint and establish: *Provided, however*, That the said Judge shall not be required to hold any courts in Bangor during said months; *and provided further*, that any law or resolve inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Chapter 112.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of Pickerel in Thomas's Pond, Norton's and Camden Pond, and Fletcher's Pond, in the County of Waldo.

Penalty for destroying Pickerel;

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That if any person within four years from the passing of this Act, shall take or destroy any Pickerel in Thomas's Pond, partly in Searsmont, in the Norton and Camden Pond, partly in Camden, and in the Fletcher Pond in Lincolnville—or any of the streams emptying into, or issuing out of either of said Ponds or in any of the waters connected therewith, he or they shall forfeit and pay a fine of one dollar for every Pickerel so taken or destroyed.

—for setting eel pots in said ponds.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That if any person or persons shall set eel pots or nets in said pond or ponds, or in any of the streams or waters connected therewith as aforesaid, for the purpose of taking said fish, or obstructing their passage in said waters, he or they shall forfeit and pay a fine of three dollars for each and every such offence.
