Mode of calling first meeting.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That any Justice of the Peace of said county may issue his warrant, directing some person, residing in said town, to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at a time and place in said warrant specified, to choose all necessary town officers.

CHAPTER 435.

AN ACT to incorporate the Harpswell Soap Stone Company.

Approved February 12, 1834.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That John Alexander, Joseph R. Thompson, and Thomas S. Pitman, with their associates and successors, be and they hereby are created a body corporate by the name of the Harpswell Soap Stone Company for the purposes, and with the power of digging and mining upon their own lands, within the town of Harpswell in the county of Cumberland, Soap Stone, Marble, or any other fossil, and to manufacture the same, at any place within this State; and to take and and hold any real estate, or personal, as may be necessary to carry into effect, the objects, for which this corporation is established, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the several Acts of this State, defining the general powers and duties, incident to manufacturing companies.

Powers, privileges, &c.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That John Alexander be and is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by giving each member thereof notice in writing, stating the time, place and purpose of said meeting, seven days, at least before it shall be holden—at which meeting any corporation business may be transacted.
