## CHAPTER 443.

AN ACT to annex a part of the town of York to the town of South Berwick.

Approved February 15, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That that part of the town of York, in the County of York, which is hereinafter limited and described, with the inhabitants thereof be, and the same hereby is set off from said town of York, and annexed to the town of South Berwick—to wit, all that part of said town of York, which lies Northwestwardly of the following described line, beginning at a rock, where the towns of South Berwick, York, and Eliot unite in a corner—thence running North fifty eight degrees East to the Southwest line of the town of Wells at a stake where said line is intersected by a road leading from Cape Neddock in York to Richard Littlefield's house in Wells, which said stake is eight hundred and sixty seven rods from Bakers spring so called. *Provided,* That the proprietors of said tract hereby set off, shall be holden to pay all taxes legally assessed on the same, remaining unpaid, to said town of York.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all persons now chargeable to the town of York, as paupers, and whose dwelling place or home at the time of their becoming so chargeable was on any part of the territory hereby annexed to South Berwick, as well as all persons having a legal settlement in said York and who have within twenty years last past had their dwelling place or home upon any part of the territory annexed as aforesaid and have within that time removed therefrom, shall hereafter be taken to have their legal settlement in, and become chargeable to said town of South Berwick.

Paupers &c. having a legal settlement in said territory set off, to be supported by South Berwick.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That in all cases where the above described dividing line, shall divide any lot of land the owner of which resides in either of said towns of York or South Berwick, the whole taxes on said lot shall be as-

sessed and collected in that town in which said owner may reside, and no part of said tax shall be assessed in said other town.

**SECT. 4.** *Be it further enacted,* That it shall be the duty of said town of South Berwick to reimburse to said town of York such portion of the State and County taxes of any year as may be assessed upon said town of York for, or on account of the property and polls which by force of this Act are annexed to said town of South Berwick, and in case of any disagreement between said towns as to the sum to be reimbursed as aforesaid, the Selectmen of the town of Kittery in said County for the time being having given to each party an opportunity to be heard in the premises shall adjudicate thereon and their award shall be final.

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#### CHAPTER 444.

AN ACT to incorporate the Frontier Bank.

Approved February 17, 1834.

**SECT. 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Samuel Wheeler, Aaron Hayden, James W. Ripley, Daniel Kilby, Frederic Hobbs, Charles Peavey, Jonathan Buck, Spencer Tinkham, Joseph C. Noyes, George Hobbs, William Eustis, Edward H. Burgin, Samuel Stevens, Joseph S. Coney, Jesse Gleason, Partmon Houghton, Gilman Lamprey, William Billings, Nathan Bucknam, Loring F. Wheeler, Leonard Shaw, Eliphalet Y. Sabine, Edward Ilsley and Lorenzo Sabine, with their associates, successors and assigns, be and hereby are created a corporation by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Frontier Bank, and shall so continue until the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty seven: *Provided,* That the persons above named, or such part of them as shall be living at the time when said corporation shall go into opera-
