thence running Northerly along the Easterly line of said lot numbered ten to the South line of town of Norridgewock, be and hereby is set off from the town of Fairfield aforesaid, and annexed to the town of Norridgewock in said County—And the inhabitants thereof shall there exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requisitions of the other inhabitants of the said town of Norridgewock—*Provided however*, that the inhabitants of Fairfield thus set off shall be holden to pay all taxes legally assessed upon them in the town of Fairfield prior to the passage of this Act.

Inhabitants to enjoy the same rights, &c. as those of Norridgewock.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That any persons, who now are or may hereafter become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as having their settlement in the town of Norridgewock, who now have their residence and settlement on the territory set off.

Paupers residing in said territory to gain a settlement in Norridgewock.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That six Polls, and the sum of Five Hundred Dollars be and the same hereby are taken from the State valuation of the town of Fairfield and set to the valuation of the town of Norridgewock.

## CHAPTER 455.

AN ACT to incorporate the Portland, Scarborough and Phippsburgh Mining Company.

Approved February 21, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That William Coolidge, Henry Moore, Rufus Horton, Junior, Moses J. Plummer, Bradbury Dearborn, Charles M. Davis, James Smith, George Knight Junior, Stephen B. Chase, Charles H. Smith, Edward Waite, George Coe, Henry R. Stickney, John B. Cross and Horace Waid, with their associates, successors and assigns be and they hereby are incorporated into a company, by the name of the Portland, Scarborough and Phippsburgh Mining Company ; for the purpose of digging

and mining Copper, Lead, Slate, Soapstone and Coal and other minerals on lands owned by said corporation, within the State, and to convert them into useful manufactures.—

Powers, privileges, liabilities, &c.

And said corporation may prosecute and defend suits at law, use a common seal, make by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State, and take and hold any estate real or personal, which may be necessary to effectuate the purposes aforesaid; and have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the liabilities and duties of similar corporations.

First meeting—  
how called.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That any three of the persons above named may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving such notice of the time and place thereof as they may deem proper.

## CHAPTER 456.

AN ACT to incorporate the Wiscasset Whale Fishing Company.

Approved February 22, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That John Brooks, William M. Boyd, Jotham Parsons, Nathaniel Coffin, William Stacy, Wilmot Wood, Barker Neal, Patrick Lenox, Joshua Damon, John Chase, Gardiner Gove and their associates and successors be and they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Wiscasset Whale Fishing Company for the purpose of carrying on the Whale Fishing at and from Wiscasset in the county of Lincoln, and by that name shall have power to sue and be sued; to use a common seal, to purchase and hold any estate real or personal for the objects of their association, to an amount not exceeding at any one time in the whole, the value of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, and the same to divide into shares, to use, manage and dispose of at their pleasure; to choose such officers; make such as-
