and mining Copper, Lead, Slate, Soapstone and Coal and other minerals on lands owned by said corporation, within the State, and to convert them into useful manufactures.—

Powers, privileges, liabilities, &c.

And said corporation may prosecute and defend suits at law, use a common seal, make by-laws for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State, and take and hold any estate real or personal, which may be necessary to effectuate the purposes aforesaid; and have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the liabilities and duties of similar corporations.

First meeting—

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That any three of the persons above named may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving such notice of the time and place thereof as they may deem proper.

## CHAPTER 456.

AN ACT to incorporate the Wiscasset Whale Fishing Company.

Approved February 22, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That John Brooks, William M. Boyd, Jotham Parsons, Nathaniel Coffin, William Stacy, Wilmot Wood, Barker Neal, Patrick Lenox, Joshua Damon, John Chase, Gardiner Gove and their associates and successors be and they hereby are constituted a body

politic and corporate by the name of the Wiscasset Whale Fishing Company for the purpose of carrying on the Whale Fishing at and from Wiscasset in the county of Lincoln,

Powers, privileges, &c.

and by that name shall have power to sue and be sued; to use a common seal, to purchase and hold any estate real or personal for the objects of their association, to an amount not exceeding at any one time in the whole, the value of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, and the same to divide into shares, to use, manage and dispose of at their pleasure; to choose such officers; make such as-

sessments, and such by-laws as may be necessary for the convenient management of their concerns, not repugnant to the laws of the State, and generally to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges incident to other corporations of a similar character.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of the said corporation, shall be holden at Wiscasset, at such time and place, and be notified in such manner as a majority of the persons named in this Act may determine.

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### CHAPTER 457.

AN ACT to incorporate the Mousum Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 22, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Jonathan Fiske, Jeremiah Brown, Moses Brown, Mordecai D. Lewis, Isaiah Hacker, Wm. E. Hucker, and David S. Brown, with their associates and successors, be and hereby are created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Mousum Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing iron and steel, cotton and woollen goods in the towns of Kennebunk, and for this purpose shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements prescribed in the several acts of the State defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing companies. And the said corporation are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars in the whole, at any one time ; and may alienate the same at pleasure.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all the corporation meetings shall be held within the town of Kennebunk; and that all the records, books of accounts and other papers, the property of said corporation shall be kept in said town of Kennebunk.
