sessments, and such by-laws as may be necessary for the convenient management of their concerns, not repugnant to the laws of the State, and generally to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges incident to other corporations of a similar character.

Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of First meeting-SECT. 2. the said corporation, shall be holden at Wiscasset, at such time and place, and be notified in such manner as a majority of the persons named in this Act may determine.

#### CHAPTER 457.

AN ACT to incorporate the Mousum Manufacturing Company.

 $\Lambda$ pproved February 22, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Jonathan Fiske, Jeremiah Brown, Moses Brown, Mordecai D. Lewis, Isaiah Hacker, Wm. E. Hucker, and David S. Brown, with their associates and successors, be and hereby are created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Mousum Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing iron and steel, cotton and woollen goods in the towns of Kennebunk, and for this purpose shall have all the powers and Powers, privi-privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements liabilities. prescribed in the several acts of the State defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing companies. And the said corporation are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars in the whole, at any one time; and may alienate the same at pleasure.

Be it further enacted, That all the corporation meetings shall be held within the town of Kennebunk; and Corporation meetings to be that all the records, books of accounts and other papers, held in town of Kennebunk. the property of said corporation shall be kept in said town of Kennebunk.
