CHAPTER 465.

AN ACT to incorporate the Lewiston Falls Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 26, 1834.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Revresentatives, in Legislature assembled, That John M. Frye, Persons incorporated. William R. Frye, their associates and successors be and they hereby are, constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Lewiston Falls Manufacturing Compa- Corporate name ny for the purpose of manufacturing Wood, Cotton, Wool, Iron and Steel, at Lewiston Falls, in the town of Lewiston and said corporation may erect such mills, dams, works, machines and buildings, and dig such canals on their own howers, privileges, &c. lands as may be necessary for carrying on these useful manufactures and branches of trade-to have and to hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars in value, and to have power Amount of real to give grant sell and dispose of the same; and shall have and personal esall the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the several Acts of this State defining the general powers and duties incident to manufacturing companies.

CHAPTER 466.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Chester.

Approved February 26, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the River Town-
