 SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That any Justice of the Peace for said County may issue his warrant, directing some person, resident in said town, to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at a time and place, specified in said warrant, for the choice of town officers, and to organize said town.

CHAPTER 467.

AN ACT to incorporate the Orrington Pier and Warehouse Company.

Approved February 26, 1834.

Persons incorporated.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That Archelaus D. Atwood, John Wilkins, Timothy Nye, Junior, John Wentworth, Jesse Atwood, Benjamin Atwood, Warren Nickerson, 2nd, Ephraim Goodale, Junior, and William G. Nickerson, their associates and successors, be and hereby are created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Orrington Pier and Warehouse Company, for the purpose of building a Pier, Wharf, and such Warehouses as may be found necessary at a place called Mill Creek in the town of Orrington with power by that name to sue and be sued; to have a common seal; to make any by-laws for the proper management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; and to take and hold any estate real or personal to the value of Twenty Thousand Dollars, and to give, grant, bargain and sell the same, with all the rights and immunities usually granted to like corporations; and shall be liable for all debts incurred by said Corporation in proportion to each share therein — *Provided*, That said Piers, Wharf, and Warehouse, shall be erected within the term of three years from and after the passage of this Act.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the first meeting of the Corporation may be called by Archelaus D. Atwood, or John Wilkins, at such time and place, as either of them may think suitable, seasonable notice thereof being first given to their respective associates.

CHAPTER 468.

AN ACT to establish the Belfast Marine Railway Company.

Approved February 26, 1834.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That Frederic A. Lewis, Nathaniel M. Lowney, William G. Crosby and Frye Hall, with their associates and successors and assigns, be and they hereby are made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Belfast Marine Railway Company for the purpose of making and supporting a Marine Railway in the town of Belfast, and by that name to sue and be sued ; and generally do and execute whatever by law shall appertain to bodies politic and corporate, and shall have power to take and hold real and personal estate to an amount, not exceeding in value Five Thousand Dollars, and shall also have power to sell, demise, exchange, or otherwise dispose of, or manage, all or any part thereof for the benefit of said corporation, and shall also have a common seal, and to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this State—And for the well ordering of said corporation shall have power to elect such officers as they shall hereafter think proper and to change them at pleasure.—And at all meetings, each proprietor present, shall be entitled to one vote for each of his shares, and each member, absent, may in like manner, vote by proxy, authorized in writing.
