#### CHAPTER 471.

AN ACT to change the name of the town of North Salem.

### Approved February 28, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passing of this Act, the name of the town of North Salem in the County of Somerset shall cease, and said town shall henceforth be called and known by the name of Salem, any thing in the Act, to which this is additional to the contrary notwithstanding; and nothing in this Act contained, shall be construed to impair any rights and liabilities of said Corporation.

### CHAPTER 472.

AN ACT to incorporate the Oxford Bridge Corporation.

Approved February 28, 1834.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That James Starr, Ezekiel Richardson, Daniel Merritt, Francis Lawrence, John S. Stone, George Gage, Caleb Jones, Joel Paine, Isaiah Rich, William Eldridge, Thomas Winslow, Enos Phinney, Samuel Small, Thomas Allen, Nehemiah Ryerson, Stillman Noyes, Nathan Crafts, Silas Jones, Junior, and Daniel Rowell, Junior, with their associates, successors and assigns be and they hereby are created, a Corporation by the name of the Oxford Bridge Corporation, and by that name may sue and be sued; have and use a common seal, choose all officers necessary to manage their business, and make by-laws for regulating their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That said Bridge shall be erected across the Androscoggin River at a place called and known by the name of Pine Island in the town of Jay,
