CHAPTER 484.

AN ACT to repeal an Act to incorporate the Odom's Ledge Fishing Company approved February first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.

Approved March 7, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Odom's Ledge Fishing Company (approved February first, one thousand eight hundred and thirty four,) be and the same is hereby repealed.

Former Act repealed.

CHAPTER 485.

AN ACT to set off Cornelius Thompson and lands from Bowdoin and annex them to Lisbon.

Approved March 7, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Cornelius Thompson with his poll and estate including all the land lying Westerly of a line, running through the centre of Little River Stream (so called) from the North to the South ends of the lot on which said Thompson now lives, where the ends of said lot intersects the line of the town of Lisbon, be and the same is hereby set off from the town of Bowdoin and annexed to the town of Lisbon — *Provided,* That said Thomp-

son shall be held to pay all taxes now legally assessed upon him and his estate in said Bowdoin previous to the passing of this Act — *And provided also*, That until a new State valuation be taken said Thompson together with the land hereby set off, shall be held to pay his, and its just proportion of all State and County taxes legally assessed thereon for the same, by said town of Bowdoin. And the Treasurer and Collector thereof for the time being, are hereby authorized to receive, demand, and recover, said taxes to the use of said Bowdoin in the same manner as if this Act had not been passed.

AN ACT to change the names of certain persons.

Approved March, 7, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That William Hutchins the third of Kennebunk Port be allowed to take the name of William Huff Hutchins; that Prudence Foster of Livermore be allowed to take the name of Prudence Read; that Joseph Sampson of the City of Portland be allowed to take the name of Joseph Bradford; that George Clark of Augusta be allowed to take the name of George Washington Snow; that George Smith of Phillips be allowed to take the name of George Ward Smith; that Ephraim Sumner Brick of Augusta be allowed to take the name of Sumner Snow Brick; that Abraham B. Woodecock of Winthrop be allowed to take the name of Ephraim Buswell Davis; that Nicholas Bates of Augusta be allowed to take the name of Charles Nicholas Bates; that Fox Beck of Augusta be allowed to take the name of Thomas Fox Beck; that Ira Witham Gott of Ellsworth be allowed to take the name of Ira Witham; that Ralph McCartee of Porter be allowed to take the name of Stilman McCartee; that Moses Titcomb Harris of the City of Portland be allowed to take
