and it shall be the duty of said Treasurer to pay to such Treasurer, Clerk, Steward or Deacon, the sum or sums which may then be due and payable as aforesaid, for the purpose of being applied for the support of the ministry in their respective religious societies—and it shall be the duty of said town Treasurer to enter upon a book to be by him kept for that purpose, a correct account of all the funds by him received, and to enter at large all notes, mortgages or other securities therein, and to collect and receive all monies which may be due and payable thereon.

Treasurer to pay the same:

—to keep account of funds received, securities, &c.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the Trustees, who are now such, under the provisions of an Act entitled “An Act to authorize the sale of the Ministerial and School Lands in the town of Rumford, passed February eighth, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen so far as it respects the Ministerial Funds within the same, to deliver over to the Trustees named in the second section of this Act, all deeds and other instruments of conveyance of any lands which now belong to, and form a part of said Ministerial Fund, together with all mortgages, notes or other securities pertaining thereto; and that so much of said Act, first above named, as respects the Ministerial Lands be and the same is hereby repealed.

Duties of Trustees.

CHAPTER 512.

AN ACT making additional appropriations for the support of Government during the year one thousand eight hundred thirty four, and for sundry other expenditures.

Approved March 13, 1834.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the following sums be, and the same are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury. And that the Governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same, viz.
