JANUARY SESSION, 1834.

Chapter 1.

Resolve in favor of Elliot G. Vaughan.

Approved January 21, 1834.

Resolved, That the Secretary of the State be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to furnish Elliot G. Vaughan, for Township No. Eight in the Ninth Range of Townships in the County of Somerset, one copy of the Laws of the State of Maine, to supply a loss of said Laws occasioned by the destruction of said Vaughan's house by fire.

Chapter 2.

Approved January 25, 1834.

Whereas at an early period after the election of Andrew Jackson to the Presidency, in accordance with the sentiments which he had uniformly expressed, the attention of Congress was called to the constitutionality and expediency of the renewal of the Charter of the United States Bank: and whereas the Bank has transcended its chartered limits in the management of its business transactions, and has abandoned the object of its creation, by engaging in political controversies, by wielding its power and influence
