RESOLVES

OF THE

FOURTEENTH LEGISLATURE

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE THIRTEENTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FOUR.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be and he is hereby authorized to procure at the expense of the State, one complete set of Greenleaf's Reports, and transmit the same to the Governor of the State of Maryland.

Chapter 12.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Approved February 12, 1834.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to John Francis and Sebattis Neptune the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the seat of Government as special Agents chosen by the tribe to call on the Executive and Legislature upon business relating to said tribe—and the Governor, with the advice of the Council be, and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 13.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Approved February 12, 1834.

Resolved, That for the reasons set forth in the petition of John Francis, Governor, and Sebattis Neptune one of the Council, of the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians, there be paid out of the Treasury of this State from the fund arising from the sale of timber taken and cut from the Indian Township, the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars to such Agent or Agents as may by the Governor and Council be authorized to lay out and expend the same; said sum to be paid in three annual instalments of Five Hundred Dollars each and to be subject as aforesaid to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council. And the Governor is requested with advice of Council to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.
